What is Dual Credit?

Dual Credit is a statewide program by which eligible high school and homeschooled students can receive high school credits and college credits for taking approved college courses.

Beginning with the graduating class of 2013, one of the required 24 units for high school graduation must be a course from:

- Honors
- Advanced Placement (AP)
- Dual Credit
- Distance Learning (online courses)

GRADE POINT AVERAGE (GPA)

Seniors

3.0 (or higher)

Sophomores

Freshmen

- Completion of 2 or more high school level courses in 8th grade with B+ or better.
- Letter of recommendation from a teacher.
- Principal or designee makes final determination.
